



FELIX ROSENQVIST UNBEATABLE AT ZANDVOORT

10.07.2015. Swedish driver Felix Rosenqvist (Prema Powerteam, 1:30.726 minutes) emerged as the fastest driver in free practice at the 4.307 kilometres long Circuit Park Zandvoort. In bright sunshine, he ended up ahead of Jake Dennis (Prema Powerteam, 1:31.021 minutes), Antonio Giovinazzi (Jagonya Ayam with Carlin, 1:31.036 minutes) and the best-placed rookie driver, Lance Stroll (Prema Powerteam, 1:31.066 minutes) in second to fourth place.

In the past, Felix Rosenqvist already made it clear on several occasions that he likes the track in the dunes of Zandvoort. This year, once again, the most seasoned driver in the field moved up to the top of the time sheets straight away after the action started. In the first part of the two heats' session, he eventually saw Charles Leclerc (Van Amersfoort Racing, 1:31.080 minutes) setting the fastest time and only ended up in eighth place himself, but in the second part, nobody was faster than Rosenqvist. His fastest time was also sufficient to claim first place in the combined free practice results.

Behind the Prema driver, his team-mate Jake Dennis was classified second, followed by Antonio Giovinazzi, Stroll and Leclerc. George Russell (Carlin, 1:31.168 minutes) was classified seventh from Julio Moreno (ThreeBond with T-Sport, 1:31.288 minutes), Alexander Albon (Signature, 1:31.299 minutes), Arjun Maini (Van Amersfoort Racing, 1:31.368 minutes) and Mikkel Jensen (kfzteile24 Mücke Motorsport, 1:31.373 minutes). Thus, seven rookie drivers made it into the top ten. Only Rosenqvist, Dennis and Giovinazzi were able to out of pace the seven fast newcomers.

Less than 15 minutes into free practice, track action came to a halt for the first time: Sam MacLeod (Motopark, 1:33.163 minutes) caused the first red flag of this weekend at Zandvoort. In the second part, the 34 young drivers had to take a break after Matt Solomon (Double R Racing, 1:32.250 minutes) had crashed, which brought the red flags out again.
