



## **FIA Formula Regional European Championship hits the halfway point of the season at the Temple of Speed**

*Monza hosts the fourth of eight rounds on the 2026 calendar this  
weekend*

Monza, 17 June 2026

The FIA Formula Regional European Championship heads to Monza on 19-21 June as part of the ACI Racing Weekend for the fourth of eight rounds on the 2026 calendar. With six different winners in the opening seven races, the series featuring the second-generation Tatuus T-326 single-seaters reaches the halfway point of the season at the Temple of Speed, home of the Formula 1 Italian Grand Prix.

After moving to the top of the standings at the most recent round in Spa, Mercedes-AMG F1 Team Junior Programme member Rashid Al Dhaheri now leads the championship by just one point. Thanks to his consistency and a victory at the Red Bull Ring season opener, the R-ace GP Emirati driver holds a slender advantage over Sebastian Wheldon, the only driver to have claimed two victories so far this season, both coming with MP Motorsport at Zandvoort.

Behind them, 13 points adrift of Al Dhaheri, sits Kean Nakamura-Berta. The

PREMA Racing's driver has claimed three pole positions, in addition to a victory at Spielberg and two further podiums. The other winners so far this season have been Reno Francot, who took CL Motorsport to its maiden victory in Austria, while rookie Alexandre Munoz (ART Grand Prix) and Maksimilian Popov (Trident Motorsport) shared the wins in Belgium.

Looking to bounce back on home soil is R-ace GP's Emanuele Olivieri, who claimed a podium finish with third place at Zandvoort and currently leads the Rookie standings by three points over Munoz. Podium finishers this season also include Rodin Motorsport pair Alex Ninovic and Reza Seewooruthun, as well as Alexander Abkhazava (MP Motorsport) and Salim Hanna (PREMA Racing).

## **WEEKEND SCHEDULE**

With a total of 10 teams and 30 drivers, the Monza round of the FIA Formula Regional European Championship will once again feature the three-race format already adopted at the Red Bull Ring. Action gets underway on Thursday with two collective test sessions, while Friday's schedule includes Free Practice from 08:30 to 09:20 CEST ahead of Qualifying 1, which is set to begin at 16:25 CEST and will see the drivers split into Group A and Group B. Race 1, held over 30 minutes plus one lap, is scheduled to start at 10:30 CEST on Saturday. Race 2, featuring a reversed grid for the top 12 drivers from Qualifying 1, will get underway at 16:25 CEST. Sunday opens with Qualifying 2 from 08:30 CEST, which will determine the grid for the final race of the weekend, due to start at 13:00 CEST.

The three races of the FIA Formula Regional European Championship from Monza will be aired across more than 200 territories. Among them is ACI Sport TV, which will broadcast both qualifying sessions and the races.
